

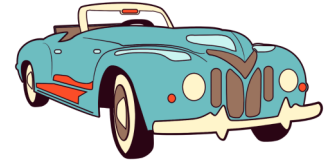


# NEWSLETTER

## Friday 23rd May 2025

### BEAULIEU

Upper School visited the Beaulieu National Motor Museum last week. Our students explored over 100 vehicles, learning about the evolution of cars—from classic models to modern speed machines—during a guided tour.



They enjoyed getting inside some of the cars from the 1960s up to the 90s, comparing their features. They discussed which vehicles had seatbelts and windshield wipers, and whether the windows rolled up and down manually or with the press of a button. One of the most exciting parts of the trip was the car ride experience! Students had the chance to get into a car that was over 100 years old and enjoy a short ride.

The staff at the museum were incredibly kind and helpful, answering students' questions about the vehicles with enthusiasm. The children had a fantastic time, taking turns and sharing their excitement. Tomas was reluctant get into the vintage car but was happy to explore the vehicles from the 1980s. The students also enjoyed looking at items from the 1970s and 1980s, including old wired phones, tabletop games, video games and vintage radios. Summer had a great time taking photos of the motorbikes.





# WEEKLY CLASS FOCUS



Maracas have enjoyed our class topic this half term – “Farm to Fork”. Each week they have focused on a different food, explored where that food comes from and what it can be used to make. The class favourite was squeezing milk out of rubber glove udders. Ajax loved flapping the wheat in bread week. Jojo loved squashing the tomatoes in tomato sauce week.

In numeracy, the children have been taking part in a number game where they take turns to roll the apple to knock down the apple trees. Chloe prefers to use her feet to knock them down. In literacy the children continue to enjoy their class sensory writing. James has wowed the staff with his engagement with this. In P.E, the children have enjoyed exploring different shaped balls and bats, hitting the ball off the cone and dropping the beanbag in the bucket.

The children made different fruit fairy cakes for cooking and explored making different textured collages in art. In RSHE, the children have been practicing brushing their teeth, washing their hands and faces. They have also enjoyed exploring food that is healthy and food that is a treat.
