A Forest School Special!

The past few months, Banjo class have been fortunate enough to have been visiting Roman Way School each week for forest school sessions. The sessions are led by a Forest School trained teacher and have given our pupils a whole host of new experiences.

They started back in October and in the lead up to Christmas, despite the cooler temperatures, they were outside in the woods; digging, collecting and searching for different natural items, sweeping, climbing, balancing, playing as well as using hand drills and saws to create their own Christmas ornaments. Finlay was very happy to have opportunities to dig and explore the different trees in the woodland.

The following term they learnt how to keep safe by an open fire. The students helped to collect sticks and build



the fire within a stone circle, and used a flint fire starter to help light the fire. Their favourite part about this term was cooking toast. Arthur loved using the fire starter to create sparks, whilst Logan and Oscar enjoyed eating their toast.







