

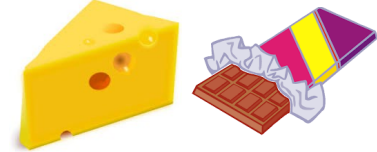

WEEKLY CLASS FOCUS



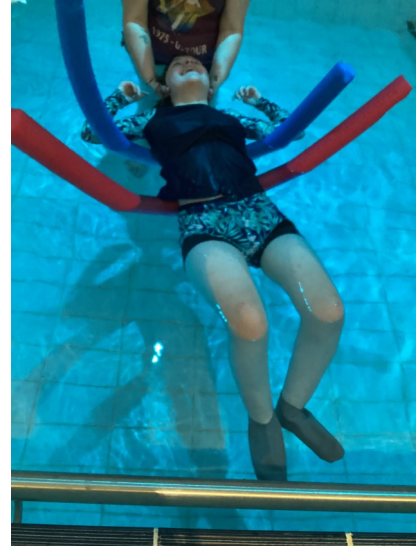
Wow, where do we start about what an amazing Summer term Trumpet class have had so far?!

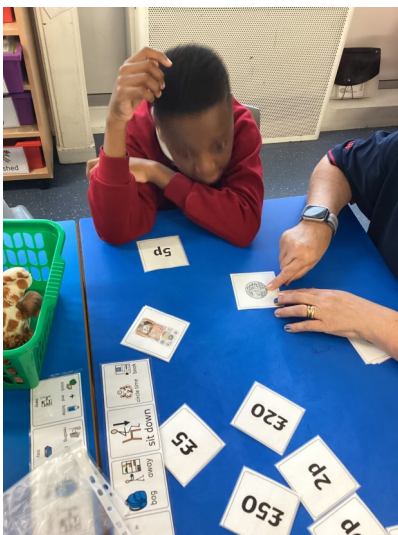



